

## Chapter 7 Classwork

### *Exercise 7-3*

Instructions: Determine which **inductive fallacy**, if any, is present in the following passages. Remember that with some passages, more than one fallacy may fit.

# 1) The idea that black people in this country live in poverty is ridiculous. Look at Obama. He's the president and he's got money. So do Denzell Washington and Oprah Winfrey.

# 2) When a car breaks down so often that repairs become pointless, the car is thrown on the junk heap. Similarly, when a person becomes old and decreed, he or she should be mercifully put to death.

# 3) The Pope has said that artificial insemination of women is immoral. We can only conclude that the practice is, in fact, immoral.

# 4) The farmers of our state have asked that we introduce legislation to provide subsidies for soybeans. Unfortunately, we will have to turn down their request.
